Offering a holistic education, it focuses on spiritual, intellectual, and emotional development, with an emphasis on literacy and numeracy.

John Pujajangka-Piyirn School proudly participates in the "I Can Run Program" with the Indigenous Marathon Foundation and has been recognised for their award-winning 'Ngurra Yungu' project, which empowers students to grow and cook food for community elders.

Teaching in Mulan, Western Australia, offers a unique and fulfilling lifestyle. Nestled on the edge of the Great Sandy Desert, this remote community provides a deep connection to First Nations culture and stunning desert landscapes. Educators can immerse themselves in the rich traditions of the Walmajarri people, enjoy a close-knit community, and experience the beauty of the outback.
