Vision and Values

Family Spirit - It is something tangibly experienced. You feel it in the warmth of the College. You feel it in the welcome and hospitality. You feel it in the lack of pretence or arrogance. You feel it in the sense of belonging and the broad inclusivity of that. You feel it in people's care and kindness. You feel it in trust and respect.

In the Way of Mary - Marcellin knew Mary would be the best possible model of one who prized each human being for their own sake. Mary shows by her humility and generosity, the claims of the common good. In a world which put up and pulled down others, Mary revealed that the real God was someone with dusty feet.

Overarching Position Statement

It is important that they are able to foster high quality relationships with students to ensure that each student is treated with dignity and feels a sense of belonging.

This position requires an individual to possess compassion, humility, patience, agility and excellent communication skills.

Pastorally, education assistants should be aligned with a vision of restorative practice across the College where correction is just, kind and forgiving.

Key Responsibilities

Catholic Ethos and Marist Traditions

- Demonstrate a personal commitment to the College Vision and Values underpinning the delivery of a Catholic education to students in our College community.
- Actively work to promote the charism of Saint Marcellin Champagnat and the mission and life of the Catholic Church within the College.
- Uphold the value and dignity of each person in relationships with staff, parents and students.
- Welcome our community warmly. Demonstrate a capacity to build a community where belonging prevails.
- Hold an image of our students as competent, capable, creative, responsible, resourceful and resilient.





Classroom Practices

- Work closely with the Educator in the support of students in their care
- Support students by listening, encouraging, reassuring, directing, re-directing, explaining, reinforcing and practising skills, concepts and instructions
- Assist in the implementation of student learning experiences, both indoor and outdoor, encouraging students to work constructively and become engaged in tasks
- Accompany and supervise student/s to and in specific designated areas within the school and to activities external to the school, with the approval of the Principal and when parent permission has been sort and granted. E.g. excursions
- Support the learning needs of students in a play-based learning environment
- Help to ensure the organisation, management and maintenance of a safe and secure educational environment
- Support the creation of resource materials
- Assist with or supervise small group or whole-class activities
- Adapt and modify the classroom environment, materials and activities as required
- Assist with observing, charting and recording student activities, skills performance or specific behaviours
- Assist with the arrival and departure of students.
- Assist students with undressing, bathing, dressing, toileting and, where necessary, cleaning soiled clothing and areas
- Assist with the care, monitoring and supervision of students' outdoor activities, including before school, recess and lunch time periods
- Participate in College community activities, such as Mass, sports days, swimming carnivals, assemblies, excursions etc
- Assist the educator with the general care and wellbeing of students, including attending to students with minor illnesses e.g. colds and the administration of minor first aid
- Foster a welcoming, safe and positive learning environment through the support and
- implementation of the College's Behaviour Management Policy and classroom rules and procedures
- Fulfil supervision duties as required by the duty roster
- Attend meetings and professional learning as necessary
- Other duties as requested by the Principal.
